TOMORROW'S WORLD TODAY

REQUIREMENTS:

1. All work must be done either individually, in pairs or in groups of no more than six students. The competition project should be run over five weeks. Only African students of architecture who are in their third year of study at a university (or the equivalent level, BTech, at a University of Technology) are eligible to take part.
2. All work submitted should be through a film of no more than 9 minutes duration, and a model/ artefact at any scale, though not to exceed 1000mm x 500mm x 500mm in dimensions, and one (1) A1 drawing, following an approved template (to be issued by the competition organisers).
3. Each institution may submit a maximum of two (2) entries, although only one (1) submission per institution will be exhibited.
4. There should be no identifying name or university symbol visible on displayed drawings, film or models/artefacts. All work must be accompanied by the registration form (on Page 2 of this pack.)

ADJUDICATION PANEL:

The University of Johannesburg will invite keynote speakers of AZA2015 to be judges of this competition, as well as selected prominent members of the architectural and film communities. Names will be released as soon as they are confirmed.

AWARDS:

The awards will be announced as soon as they are confirmed.

DISQUALIFICATION:

A submission shall be excluded from the competition:

1. If received after the date and time of submission;
2. If, in the opinion of the judges, it substantially differs from requirements of the brief;
3. If a competitor discloses their identity or attempts to improperly influence the jury decision;
4. If any of the mandatory requirements of the competition are not met.
